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




I'll live for Je - sus and shine my light.

God's Servant Moses

Lesson Text: Numbers 16:23–34

Do you remember the Bible story about a little baby boy whose mother put him in a basket in the river to keep him safe? His name was Moses.

One day when Moses was grown up and in the desert, he saw a bush that was on fire. But the bush did *not* burn up!

“Moses! Moses!” God called from the bush. “I know that My people are slaves in Egypt. I know they are treated very badly. I want you to go to the king of Egypt and tell him to let My people go to their own land.” Moses obeyed God and became the leader of God’s people.

Moses led God’s people out of Egypt. He led them across the Red Sea. Day after day, Moses served God by leading His people.

But the people started to disobey God after they were out of Egypt. Finally, God said it would take years and years for the people to get back to their homeland. In fact, only the young people would ever get back to the land of Canaan.

Three men got tired of Moses being the leader. These men found 250 more men who agreed with them. They all went to Moses and his brother, Aaron, and said, “Why have you made yourselves the leaders?”

Moses was greatly upset with these men. Moses knew God had called *him* to be the leader. Moses told the men to meet him by the tabernacle door. He told all the people to stand far away from these men. “If these
