SCRIPTURE LESSON TEXT

EX. 16:2 And the whole congregation of the children of Israel murmured against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness:

3 And the children of Israel said unto them, Would to God we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the flesh pots, *and* when we did eat bread to the full; for ye have brought us forth into this wilderness, to kill this whole assembly with hunger.

4 Then said the LORD unto Moses, Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you; and the people shall go out and gather a certain rate every day, that I may prove them, whether they will walk in my law, or no.

5 And it shall come to pass, that on the sixth day they shall prepare *that* which they bring in; and it shall be twice as much as they gather daily.

6 And Moses and Aaron said unto all the children of Israel, At even, then ye shall know that the LORD hath brought you out from the land of Egypt:

7 And in the morning, then ye shall see the glory of the LORD; for that he heareth your murmurings against the LORD: and what *are* we, that ye murmur against us?

8 And Moses said, *This shall be*, when the LORD shall give you in the evening flesh to eat, and in the morning bread to the full; for that

the LORD heareth your murmurings which ye murmur against him: and what *are* we? your murmurings *are* not against us, but against the LORD.

9 And Moses spake unto Aaron, Say unto all the congregation of the children of Israel, Come near before the LORD: for he hath heard your murmurings.

10 And it came to pass, as Aaron spake unto the whole congregation of the children of Israel, that they looked toward the wilderness, and, behold, the glory of the LORD appeared in the cloud.

11 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

12 I have heard the murmurings of the children of Israel: speak unto them, saying, At even ye shall eat flesh, and in the morning ye shall be filled with bread; and ye shall know that I *am* the LORD your God.

13 And it came to pass, that at even the quails came up, and covered the camp: and in the morning the dew lay round about the host.

14 And when the dew that lay was gone up, behold, upon the face of the wilderness *there lay* a small round thing, as small as the hoar frost on the ground.

15 And when the children of Israel saw *it*, they said one to another, *It is* manna: for they wist not what it *was*. And Moses said unto them, *This is* the bread which the LORD hath given you to eat.

God Provides Manna and Quail

Lesson Text: Exodus 16:2-15

Related Scriptures: I Corinthians 10:1-10; Exodus 6:1-8;
John 6:30-58; Numbers 11:4-34

TIME: 1445 B.C.

PLACE: Wilderness of Sin

GOLDEN TEXT—“Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst” (John 6:35).

Preparing to Teach the Lesson

As we begin to teach the concept of God’s preparation of the Israelite nation, remember that they had just been delivered from generations of slavery in Egypt. They had to be taught morals, ethics, and values. The Israelites needed to become a functional society that could reflect their Sovereign’s character.

TODAY’S AIM

Facts: to see that the Lord provides for the needs of His people.

Principle: to understand how God taught His children to obey Him.

Application: to personally learn obedience from God’s work in our life.

INTRODUCING THE LESSON

Israel had little idea about what God expected of them. They were not sure who Moses was or if they should listen to him. If they were to survive the walk to the Promised Land, they would have to learn to honor and obey God.

DEVELOPING THE LESSON

1. Israel complains against God and His servant (Ex. 16:2-3). Israel needed food, but they were used to the food of their old life in Egypt, so

they compared their lifestyle of freedom to their lifestyle of bondage. We might doubt that slaves were ever given “bread to the full.” Still, they proclaimed their wish that they had died in Egypt! But God is a glorious God, and the provision He was about to make for His people far exceeded their fare under slavery.

2. God tells His answer to Moses (Ex. 16:4-8). God explained the plan to Moses, and Moses communicated it to Israel. Moses is particularly careful to point out that the people’s murmurings were not against him and Aaron, but against the Lord.

3. God gives the answer to Israel (Ex. 16:9-12). When Aaron conveyed the plan to Israel, they looked toward the wilderness and saw the glory of the Lord. This was not just a beautiful sunset, but a revelation of the Shekinah-glory of God, a special manifestation of His presence. They were to understand that God was answering their complaints.

The underlying meaning of this exercise was to tell Israel that He was their sovereign God and their Provider. It may be that most of our life
