

# God Remains the Same




Some-times lands and peo-ple change. We can nev-er know.


Some-times strong, wild storms may come and the fierce winds blow.

God had brought Moses and the people of Israel out of Egypt in an amazing way. They walked right through the Red Sea on dry ground! They had escaped the hard life of slavery. After God did that, they should have been thankful and happy because God was taking care of them.

But instead, they began to complain to Moses and Aaron, their leaders. “We are going to die of hunger out here in the wilderness!” However, God had already said that He would lead them into the Promised Land of Canaan. They should have trusted Him.

God heard their grumbles. He then told Moses, “I will rain down bread from heaven every morning for you and the people to gather and eat.”

When the morning dew dried up each day, there were small, round flakes left. The people were to pick them up. They were only to collect enough to eat for one day. They did this five days a week. On the sixth day, they gathered extra food for day seven.

The people called the small flakes “manna.” Moses reminded them this was bread given to them by God.
