SCRIPTURE LESSON TEXT

LEV. 8:1 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

2 Take Aaron and his sons with him, and the garments, and the anointing oil, and a bullock for the sin offering, and two rams, and a basket of unleavened bread;

3 And gather thou all the congregation together unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.

4 And Moses did as the LORD commanded him; and the assembly was gathered together unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.

5 And Moses said unto the congregation, This *is* the thing which the LORD commanded to be done.

6 And Moses brought Aaron and his sons, and washed them with water.

7 And he put upon him the coat, and girded him with the girdle, and clothed him with the robe, and put the ephod upon him, and he girded him with the curious girdle of

the ephod, and bound *it* unto him therewith.

8 And he put the breastplate upon him: also he put in the breastplate the Urim and the Thummim.

9 And he put the mitre upon his head; also upon the mitre, *even* upon his forefront, did he put the golden plate, the holy crown; as the LORD commanded Moses.

10 And Moses took the anointing oil, and anointed the tabernacle and all that was therein, and sanctified them.

11 And he sprinkled thereof upon the altar seven times, and anointed the altar and all his vessels, both the laver and his foot, to sanctify them.

12 And he poured of the anointing oil upon Aaron's head, and anointed him, to sanctify him.

13 And Moses brought Aaron's sons, and put coats upon them, and girded them with girdles, and put bonnets upon them; as the LORD commanded Moses.

NOTES

Ordination of Aaron and His Sons

Lesson Text: Leviticus 8:1-13

Related Scriptures: Exodus 29:1-37; Hebrews 10:19-25; Acts 22:14-16

TIME: about 1445 B.C.

PLACE: Mount Sinai

GOLDEN TEXT—“Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water” (Hebrews 10:22).

Preparing to Teach the Lesson

TODAY'S AIM

Facts: to observe three very important aspects of God's holiness.

Principle: to emphasize that God's children are to reflect the holiness of their Heavenly Father.

Application: to investigate our personal lives with a goal of becoming more consistent in our personal holiness.

INTRODUCING THE LESSON

The first five books of the Bible (also known as the Pentateuch) comprise the historical record of many beginnings.

The book of Leviticus continues the narrative of beginnings.

DEVELOPING THE LESSON

There are three requirements of biblical holiness that can be clearly discerned from Leviticus 8:1-13.

1. A thorough understanding of that which God requires (Lev. 8:1-3). Notice here that Aaron's sanctification took much more than well-mean-

ing effort. The Lord had very specific requirements that He demanded be met. For Aaron, the sanctification process required “the garments, and the anointing oil, and a bullock for the sin offering, and two rams, and a basket of unleavened bread.” While these elements have symbolic meaning, they all point to the fact that sanctification, becoming holy, is not a process of our own design. We must know and submit to God's requirements.

2. A clear determination to give God the glory (Lev. 8:4-5). Not only is it insufficient to try to be holy on our own terms, but it is also insufficient to seek holiness with the wrong intentions. In verses 4-5, we see Moses' desire to give all the glory to God, not himself.

3. Complete obedience in following God's instructions (8:6-13). After one has clearly understood God's requirements for holiness and has demonstrated the right motives, there is still an important step remaining: the believer must follow through completely by diligently following God's instruc-
